Message from the Director

As someone who runs an innovative family organisation that helps thousands of people every year I know that what we do is important and crucial. But it is really only when clients have the opportunity to clearly tell us the difference we make to them personally that I can see just how vital a lifeline we are.

Christine spoke at our 2008 Graduation Ceremony in Dublin Castle and she told us how overnight her life was shattered as her husband left her with a newborn child and a mountain of debt:

"I isolated myself with the feeling of desperation and a big part also was being ashamed to be a single parent...I was at the end; I was so down that I wanted to take my life."

Shame and that feeling of not being a family is a huge issue for the people we meet every day who are working so hard already on raising their children in difficult circumstances.

Christine went on to say:

"I needed a few pushes to overcome the feeling of embarrassment and shame of being a lone parent and having failed to be a NORMAL family. What I want to tell and emphasize here is that it is a FACT that One Family saved my life in many ways. The person I am now is because of One Family. I learnt the most important things and tools here in this organisation. Today I am proud

of being a lone parent, knowing in my heart that my daughter and me – we are a family."

There are many women and men like Christine out there and we work hard to try to offer an excellent service based on our unique values to all of them.

2008 was an important year in the implementation of our One Family Services model as we continued to expand our expertise in the area of progression of lone parents from welfare into sustainable employment via education and training.

We developed our expertise in this area through the publication of our national research on *Lone Parents & Employment*; the piloting of our New Futures training model and specialist training for statutory providers working in the area of progression.

We are sharing this multifaceted expertise with policy makers as our goal as an organisation is to ensure that successful interventions and policies are developed to ensure lone parents progressing from welfare can ultimately access sustainable employment.

The provision of specialist parenting supports for people parenting alone and sharing parenting continues to be in high demand. Because of this we have expanded our one-to-one Parent Mentoring service despite having no statutory support for this highly successful intervention. Our popular group-based parenting courses continue to expand and we will have new additions in this area in 2009.

I look forward to the development of our next strategy which will be built for success in these changed times and I thank our supportive and expert Board, the wonderful staff team I get to work with every day and the families who trust us and teach us everything we know.

One Family Strategy 2007–09

Building a Great Future for One-Parent Families in Ireland

Our strategy is central to our daily work and we wanted to align our 2008 Annual Review to it. For full information on our strategy please see **www.onefamily.ie**.

How will we know we have achieved our Strategic Goals?

By 2016 One Family will have achieved the following:

- The Constitution will recognise and afford respect to all family forms including one-parent families;
- Poverty rates for one-parent families will be significantly lowered and will be comparable to that of the general population; and
- One-parent families will be widely recognised, understood and celebrated as positive family forms.

What are we going to do to achieve our Vision with this Strategy?

Client Services Strategy: We will empower all members of all types of one-parent families to create their own positive future through our innovative family support services.

In 2008 highlights in this area included the ongoing implementation of our integrated services model, the funding of the New Futures pilot and our Client Graduation Day in Dublin Castle which was attended by Minister Sean Haughey, T.D.

One Family provided 4,000 individual services to over 1,000 families in 2008. Our integrated services model means that we guide clients from one service to another to assist them in progressing to the stage that they are ready to leave One

Family and move on to a mainstream service provider or none at all.

New Futures

What is so unique about New Futures is the integration of specialist family supports such as parent mentoring, information sessions and counselling with individual key working and a specialist 30-session FETAC accredited training course. This FÁS-funded pilot is thoroughly monitored on an ongoing basis and will be externally evaluated in 2009 to ensure excellent learning for the next phase towards mainstream implementation. Through community based outreach 14 participants who met the project's criteria were recruited and they then underwent a thorough needs assessment before starting.

The purpose is to test whether this integrated progression model comprising family supports and personal supports is more successful than current mainstream interventions. We look forward to the results in 2009.

Training & Consultancy

As part of our commitment to improving the lives of oneparent families, One Family has a Training for Trainers service where we can leverage our learning out to other service providers. We were delighted to secure funding in 2008 to be able to roll out free comprehensive training on working with one-parent families to all the Family Resource Centres in the south-east region in a project supported by The Wheel and the Family Support Agency. We look forward to being able to provide more information on this in coming years.



Legal & Policy Strategy: We will achieve equality for one-parent families through leading constitutional, legal and policy changes in Ireland.

One Family Policy & Research:

One of our major research projects on Lone Parents and Employment: What are the Real Issues? Was completed, published and launched in 2008 by One Family staff. Funded by the Combat Poverty Agency and facilitated by the Department of Social & Family Affairs, we carried out a major quantitative



study of lone parents on the

One-Parent Family Payment (OFP) in order to provide nationally representative data on the real issues lone parents and their families face in seeking, obtaining and progressing in employment. The research highlighted the high level of motivation among lone parents on the OFP to work and to progress their skills and qualifications, as well as the importance they attach to parenting. This research report was launched by Minister Mary Hanafin, TD, at a seminar featuring the CEO of Gingerbread (GB) as well as representatives of all the Social Partners. This was very enthusiastically received with significant coverage in national media and a strong involvement by key policy makers.

Practice to Policy

As part of taking the learning we have from our clients to policy makers our staff and board members participate in a number of representational committees in a range of organisations such as The Equality Authority, The Children's Rights Alliance, National Women's Council, Social Research Association, Social Policy Network, European Anti-Poverty Network, Crisis Pregnancy Agency Consultative Committee, Eurochild, Telephone Helplines Association, Fingal County Childcare Committee, Dublin City Childcare Group, Childcare Information Service Dublin South-East and South Dublin Voluntary Groups.

We work constantly with national and regional print media, radio and TV in order to get our message out there and in 2008 we had 86 media hits.

Attitudinal Change Strategy: We will ensure that one-parent families are cherished equally by inspiring others with the realities of family diversity.

It is important to us in One Family to celebrate the UN International Day of the Family every year on 15 May as we are a family organisation and we hold the concept of family close to our hearts. However for us family is not just about the Constitutionally described marital family. We have a much broader experience of family life based in the realities of the lives of the people we work with. We are also aware that Mother's Day and Father's Day can be difficult for children and parents in one-parent families and so a Family Day is a terrific option. In 2008 we rolled out a media campaign with corporate support to draw attention to the day and calling for Constitutional reform to the definition of family. There was national and regional interest in our message and we will build on this in future years.

As well as these three externally-focused key strategy areas we also have a number of other strategies that assist us in reaching our vision and the most relevant of these is our **Funding Strategy**: To secure funding from a broad range of social investors and supporters in order to meet the current needs and future ambitions of the organisation.

Our new Funding Strategy has increased our work in community-based events such as regular weekend bag packs in supermarkets, sports events and table quizzes where the numbers of our supporters have grown. We also held our first highly successful food masterclass *How to have a Champagne Party on a Buck's Fizz Budget* hosted by two well known food personalities, Ross Golden-Bannon and Domini Kemp.
