Fuel Allowance

Fuel Allowance is a payment that helps with the cost of heating your home during the colder months. It is paid to people who are dependant on long-term social welfare or Health Service Executive (HSE) payments, including one parent families and it provides some contribution to the increased cost of heating bills in the winter.

You may qualify for a fuel allowance if you are getting one of the following:

- One-Parent Family Payment
- Widow's or Widowers', Surviving Civil Partner(Contributory and Non-Contributory) Pension or State Pension (Contributory and Non Contributory)
- Deserted Wife's Benefit or Allowance
- Basic Supplementary Welfare Allowance
- Disability Allowance

and you are living alone or with dependent children.

The Fuel Allowance is €20 per week and is paid for 26 weeks of the year from September to April. In 2012 the payment will end on 6th April.

The fuel allowance is paid in the same way as you receive your main payment.

To apply for the Fuel Allowance fill in application form NFS 1. This application form is available from your local post office or text FORM FUEL, followed by your name and address, to 51909.

If you apply for the Fuel Allowance after the start of the heating season (the last week in September), the allowance will not be backdated.

Send your completed form to the section of the Department of Social Protection that pay you or the Community Welfare Officer if you are receiving Supplementary Welfare Allowance.
